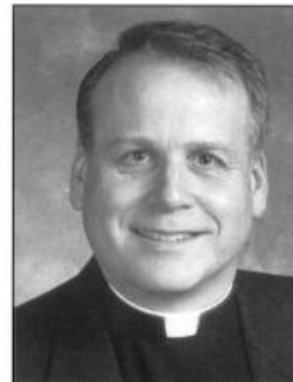

1. What's the New Roman Missal All About?
