Monsignor Kevin Irwin is a priest of the archdiocese of New York who is the Dean of the School of Theology and Religious Studies at The Catholic University of America. He holds the Walter J. Schmitz, Chair of Liturgical Studies. Monsignor Irwin has authored fourteen books on liturgy and sacraments including *Models of the Eucharist*. He has been a consultant to the USCCB Committee on Divine Worship since November 2004 and a member of the Leeds Group, founded by Bishop Arthur Roche of the Diocese of Leeds, England to prepare materials for the implementation of the third edition of the Roman Missal.

Reverend Paul Turner, a priest of the diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph, is pastor of St. Munchin parish in Cameron, MO and its mission, St. Aloysius in Maysville. His books include *Let Us Pray: A Guide to the Rubrics of Sunday Mass*, and *When Other Christians Become Catholic*. Fr. Turner writes "Bulletin Inserts" for *Ministry and Liturgy*. He is a former president of the North American Academy of Liturgy and a team member for the North American Forum on the Catechumenate. He has served as a translator for the International Commission on English in the Liturgy. His community work includes consultation on Christian art for the Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art in Kansas City.
